Church in the Heights, Glendive, Montana

This building is being renovated to house mission teams and church planting residents. The church is being replanted in Glendive, a town of 4,758. This former education building is being repurposed because Montana needs churches. In a population of 1,132,812, only 121 SBC churches are functioning.

Our part in renovation is to replace windows and add insulation to the outer walls. 36 windows need to be replaced.

Thirty-four windows will cost \$430.00 each.

How many windows will your church buy? Can your church donate to cover the food costs of your 5-member mission team? (We will cook for ourselves in this building Monday through Thursday).





My first year as BSU Director was one of goals and evaluation. My primary goal was to see the gospel of Jesus Christ permeate everything that the BSU did. I believe that I have discovered what things need to stay the same, and what important changes we can make to better reach our campus with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Connection is key at Crowder - students want someone to *go to them*, to reach out and be available, to genuinely care. My wife and I saw the most discipleship, the most spiritual growth, the most "Holy Spirit moments," when we simply had genuine conversations with students, took them out to eat, and went to their sports games. In every scenario, we are on a mission - to disciple, evangelize, encourage, or challenge. We aren't just being friends. We have limited time with these students, and we have to make the most of every moment.

So, what specific changes and goals will we be seeing with the BSU next semester. Right now, I am still meeting with our committee and talking with relevant persons to make sure we are approaching these things the right way. My plan is to visit *you*, the local churches, this summer, and give a presentation on what we have done, what we plan to do, and answer any questions you might have. So until then, I ask you pray that the Lord would direct our decision making for His glory, that we would do the utmost to reach our campus with His gospel and His love.
